DISCUSSION

a. Sustainable Fashion

Using it in an industry that involves many individuals and resources in its marketing becomes essential. Rosidah and Suhartini [3] the goal of sustainable fashion is to bring together various groups in the fashion industry: designers, manufacturers, distributors, to consumers (users) to work together to change the way a fashion item is sourced, produced, and consumed in a better direction [1].

Namely the ability to minimize the use of materials when cutting fabrics, as well as the reuse, recycle and reduce movements of fashion products, as well as the use of environmentally friendly materials when producing fashion products. This concept eliminates or minimizes clothing production waste so that it does not produce waste or residual waste that pollutes the environment. Environmental pollution, if it occurs, will harm ecological sustainability. Zero waste has a purpose: a) Creating clothes that minimize the demolition of the fashion industry; b) Making a change in the mindset of being creative; c) Zero-waste fashion products have characteristics and uniqueness that other clothing does not; d) Create awareness of the negative impact of the fast fashion industry.

The zero waste technique used is a draping technique. The draping technique is a type of pattern making, in addition to construction techniques that require making patterns beforehand. The result of the process of making dress patterns with draping techniques and construction techniques will both produce basic designs. However, in the broken dating technique, the way according to the model can be made directly on top of the dress form without completing the basic pattern first.

Joane E. Blair (1992) defines *draping* as: "The technique used to create garments by draping fabrics on the dress form. A pattern is then cut from the draped segments and made into the designer's sample garment". The draping pattern is a basic pattern made with solid or cube construction, and the way is formed on the wearer's body or its imitation, a dress form or paspop. In making the draping technique, the tools and materials needed are Dressfoam/sewing doll, tape measure/centimeter, pin, hand needle, ruler, pencil and sewing chalk, fabric scissors, sewing carbon, and more rad, cord rope, blaco/paper tella/ basic materials used for draping, but in party dresses usually use satin and chiffon [7].

c. Segara Kelangon Art Fashion Works

The following is an aesthetic analysis of the elements of art and the principles of fashion design in the Segara Kelangon Art Fashion works, namely:

- a. The element of arts in Segara Kelangon Art Fashion works; the line element consists of curved lines, abstract shape elements are formed from draping techniques, and the color element in the clothing is light blue, which comes from the idea of a lighter crashing on the beach waves. These texture elements form waves and are not transparent. The size used by the model is size "M," and the intensity of the blue color in fashion design is more towards the light. The direction element in fashion design radiates to the center.
- b. The principles of fashion design in the Segara Kelangon Art Fashion works; the application of the design principle of rhythm in design is a line of waves that radiate to the center formed by the draping technique, the application of the principle of harmony design in design in light blue color and curve shape, application of the principle of proportion design in design, namely 1 (top part): 2 (bottom part), the application of the design principle of balance in design, namely symmetrical balance looks balanced on the left and right sides, the application of the design principle of the center of attention in a wavy line that radiates to the center formed from the draping technique in the center of the front of the dress, and The application of the principle of unitary design to design, namely the unity of the light blue color in each piece of clothing.

CONCLUSION

Segara kelangon means the beauty of the waves of the sea, the endless sea, which is applied by the freestyling draping technique that is not cut off. The aesthetics of this clothing include a cocktail dress intended for morning or afternoon parties. The light blue or light blue color itself symbolizes honesty and trust.

Later, the clothes can be familiar after making clothes using the freestyling draping technique. Please make or buy from slow fashion brands based on the production and use of clothes with an extended period, durability and high quality, and ethical and environmentally friendly production processes. They are focusing on something other than the speed of mass production, like fast fashion. Slowly, the priority is quality, not quantity.

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
